MILWAUKEE FILM FESTIVAL

The cornerstone of Milwaukee Film's programs, our annual Milwaukee Film Festival (MFF) attracted a record number of attendees throughout the 15-day event. Our citywide celebration reached even farther this year, as we added the Rivoli Theater in Cedarburg and the Broadway Theatre Center in the Third Ward as Festival venues. This year's favorite film was *Toni Morrison: The Pieces I Am,* which took home the Allan H. (Bud) and Suzanne L. Selig Audience Award.

CULTURES AND COMMUNITIES PROGRAMS

Milwaukee Film has established a new Cultures and Communities initiative to support our goal to engage our entire community in our mission and programs. This initiative will advance programs such as Black Lens, Cine Sin Fronteras, and GenreQueer, while also creating new platforms. Several events in 2019 laid the foundation for this work, including Black History Month programming, the Milwaukee Muslim Film Festival in April, and the inaugural Minority Health Film Festival in September.
