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
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# **WELCOME**

This time next year, we'll be celebrating a major milestone: our tenth Milwaukee Film Festival.

At the start of this, our ninth year, we thought we would lie low and save all the big stuff for next year.

2017 had other ideas.

For starters, we saw one of our founding dreams come true: Beginning in July 2018, Milwaukee Film will have its very own year-round venue. And not just any venue: the gorgeous, historic Oriental Theatre. That means we have a place of our own to provide this city with the best and brightest that cinema has to offer, 365 days a year.

But 2017 didn't stop there.

We also found ourselves leading a larger-by-the-minute initiative to convene, support, and grow the film industry in southeastern Wisconsin, an effort now titled the Milwaukee Filmmaker Alliance (MFA). In the two years since a small group of people met to discuss the idea, we have formed a coalition representing dozens of companies and hundreds of individuals to ensure Milwaukee's film industry flourishes.

But 2017 still wasn't finished with the big news.

Three years ago, with the help of many generous community members, we established the Brico Forward Fund, an initiative dedicated to providing local filmmakers with the funding and production resources needed to make new work. And at this year's film festival, we're proud to present the first film made possible in part by this funding: our Centerpiece Film, Milwaukee filmmaker Erik Ljung's *The Blood is at the Doorstep*. Ljung's debut feature-length documentary made its world premiere at SXSW earlier this year, and has since traveled the festival circuit, receiving critical accolades along the way.

Not bad for what started as a "low-key year." But also not surprising. All of this only happens because of the increasing support we receive from festival goers like you, as well as our loyal members, donors, sponsors, and Community Partners, our generous board of directors, and the tireless staff at Milwaukee Film.

It's an enormous amount of time, effort, and work for all involved, and we can think of no better reward than to sit back and enjoy this year's outstanding festival lineup.





### Important Note

To guarantee a seat for a film, ticket and pass holders must arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to scheduled showtime. Ticket and pass holders arriving less than 15 minutes prior to scheduled showtime cannot be guaranteed a seat and will be seated only as capacity allows and at the discretion of Festival staff. No refunds or exchanges are available to ticket and pass holders who are refused entry after this time.



one: as soon as possible! Many of our screenings sell out, leaving sad people who can't get tickets. Don't be one of those people. Buy your tickets early!

### When should I arrive to a screening?

If you have a ticket for a film, we highly recommend you arrive a minimum of 30 minutes prior to showtime to guarantee a seat. All ticket and pass holders must arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to the scheduled showtime to guarantee a seat. Beginning 15 minutes before the show, any empty seats will be sold to patrons in the Rush Tickets line (see below).

### What if a screening is sold out?

If a film is listed as "Rush Line Only" online, there's still hope! You can join the Rush Tickets line at the venue to buy any unclaimed seats. Rush Tickets are sold on a first-come, first-served basis, so get in line early. There's also a chance the film will be screening again during the Festival. Check your program guide for days, times, and locations.

### What are Rush Tickets?

Rush Tickets are last-minute tickets to sold-out screenings and become available 15 minutes prior to showtime. Rush Tickets are sold at full price and are not subject to discounts.

### How do I know which screenings have gone to Rush status?

Every day at noon during the Festival, we update mkefilm.org/rush to let you know which screenings have gone to Rush status and which screenings are selling quickly.

### Can I purchase same-day tickets?

Absolutely! Same-day tickets are available at all five box office locations up until each film's showtime or until a film has gone to Rush. (Not available online or by phone.)

### I thought tickets were green. Why is my ticket yellow?

You have a voucher, not a ticket. Yellow vouchers must be exchanged for green tickets to specific festival films valued at \$12 or less, depending on ticket availability. Vouchers may be exchanged at any box office no later than 15 minutes before the film begins and should be converted to tickets prior to entering the ticket-holder line.

### How can I get a Member discount?

Milwaukee Film Members pay up to 20 percent less for tickets and passes and 15 percent less for merchandise during the film festival. Throughout the year, they also get to take advantage of many other great benefits (see p. 11 for more information). If you aren't a Member yet, sign up at **mkefilm.org/** membership or at any box office to enjoy these discounts immediately!

### Can I bring kids to the Film Festival?

Yes, we're a kid-friendly festival! However, not all films have MPAA ratings. Some movies might contain material unsuitable for children, so please use discretion when selecting films for youths. Age-appropriate films are available in the Rated K: For Kids program listed on p. 70.
